Generations Christian School welcomes homeschool students who wish to participate in individual classes. Because these students are joining the GCH community for a limited portion of their school week, they are expected to respect and follow the school's Christian philosophy, conduct standards, dress standards, and classroom expectations while participating in classes at GCH.

Enrollment in a GCH class does not require a student to become a full-time GCH student. But if you attend classes here, you agree to honor the Christian environment and standards of GCH."

School Communication Procedures:

Teachers will communicate regularly with parents through Google Classroom, Procure, and email.

Parent Responsibilities

Parents are responsible for overseeing their student's education, including attendance, assignments, academic progress, and work habits. Parents should provide structure and support at home and work with teachers and administration as needed to help their students succeed.

Textbooks and Materials

Parents are responsible for purchasing the textbooks and required materials for their students' classes. GCH will provide a list of required materials but reserves the right to add materials as needed during the school year.

Standards of Behavior and Speech

1 Peter 3:8--Finally, all of you be of one mind, having compassion for one another, love as brothers, be tenderhearted, be courteous...

*In addition to the requirements listed below, it should be understood that each teacher will have a particular classroom culture and set of classroom rules and rewards by which all students should abide.

Behavior

Refrain from any careless, unkind, foolish, or rude behavior. Let the command to "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you," be your guide. Commit to representing Christ in your attitudes and behaviors toward others.

Bullying, physical aggression, recklessness, abuse of property, or violent behavior that endangers others will NOT be tolerated.

Students who enroll in individual classes:

- Must agree to the school's Christian philosophy and conduct expectations.
- Must follow the rules that apply while they are on campus.



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- Are still expected to meet the school's standards for modesty, behavior, technology, and respect.
- Students are expected to attend all scheduled classes and arrive on time.
- Students may not skip class to avoid tests, quizzes, assignments, presentations, or other work. Missed work due to an unexcused absence will receive a zero..

Dress Code

GCH is a Christian school and expects students to dress in a manner that reflects modesty, neatness, cleanliness, and respect for themselves and others. These standards apply to all students, including students attending A la Carte classes. Students must wear a collared polo shirt in **yellow, white, blue, black, or gray**. The bottom two buttons must remain fastened. Students may wear short- or long-sleeved polos.

Parents should cooperate in enforcing these standards. Students who arrive at school who do not meet dress code guidelines may not be allowed to attend class. The following pants are to be worn:

- Jeans without holes (no holes are allowed in the student's jeans), cargo pants, slacks (including black and khaki slacks).
- Bottoms must be worn at the waist.
- Skirts and shorts that are two inches above the top of the knee (this is appropriate 3 fingers above the top of the knee).
- No leggings, yoga or tight fitting pants are allowed. Clothing should not be tight or revealing.
- No sweatpants (loose, warm trousers with an elasticized or drawstring waist, worn when exercising or as leisurewear).
- No pajama tops or bottoms may be worn to school.
- No chewing gum- this is to prevent the gum from being placed on furniture and on the carpet.
- No sunglasses
- Sweatshirts and sweaters may be worn, but must not depict disrespectful logos, images, or language that targets others or illegal substances of any kind. They should also not be worn to hide a lack of polo shirt.
- Hats may be worn, but must not depict inappropriate language or logo.
- Appropriate footwear should be worn at school. Tennis shoes, sneakers, sandals, and Crocs are allowed. Slippers and flip-flops are not allowed.



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- All clothing must not depict disrespectful logos, images, or language that targets others or illegal substances of any kind.

The administration reserves the right to determine whether clothing meets the school's standards.

Technology, Cell Phones, Property, and Internet Personal Property

Show respect for others' property by using only what you have permission to use.

Keep personal items inappropriate for classroom activities at home. Any violation of this rule may result in an item being confiscated and held until a parent retrieves it. A few examples of such items are toys, knives, cell phones, gaming devices, off-topic media, books, magazines, laser pointers, etc.

Knives, weapons and sharp objects are strictly prohibited on the campus of Generations Christian School.

Restitution for abuse or neglect of others' property, including school property, will be the responsibility of the member causing damage.

Electronic Devices/Cell Phones

Students attending GCH for individual classes are also expected to follow the school's electronic-device policy while on campus. If a student will need their phone and thus must bring it to school, it must be checked in upon arrival. Students may not leave their phone in their backpack. If a student needs to contact a parent during school hours, they will use the administrator's phone; students are not to retrieve their cellphones to contact their parents after it has been turned in. Likewise, if a parent needs to reach their student during the day, they can call the assigned administrator at 561-508-3579.

We recommend that parents save this number in their phones. Please note: do not send text messages; please call instead. Procure messages are also acceptable, but they are not checked as often as necessary for a time-sensitive matter. Please call instead.



Computers

Computers can be used in class ONLY as allowed by the teacher under supervision. They are not to be used outside of class without express permission from a teacher or administrator.

- Headphones are not to be worn at school without teacher permission and supervision.
- Watching movies on laptops is not allowed at any time.
- Students are not allowed to wear smartwatches to school.

Violations

Any electronic device used contrary to this policy may be confiscated. The administration will determine the appropriate consequence based on the nature and frequency of the violation.

A student who knowingly brings or uses a prohibited device in violation of this policy may be subject to disciplinary action.

The administration reserves the right to make reasonable exceptions when necessary for medical, safety, family, or other legitimate circumstances.

Homework

Parents, please understand that in all classes the content builds on the previous work, and if you want your student to attain the full outcome, all assignments must be completed.

Late Work Policy

The homework policy is found on the class' course syllabus. Students and families should be familiar with these policies and abide by them.

Absent Due to Vacation

Students are encouraged to retrieve assignments from Google drive/ Google Classroom and try to stay current on classwork. It is the family's responsibility to determine how the child will complete his/her work. Tests will not be given in advance and cannot be rescheduled to accommodate travel plans.

Individual Homework

The following actions will be considered events of academic dishonesty should they be determined to have occurred during the completion of homework:



- All homework assigned is to be completed individually unless otherwise directed by the instructor.
- The act of two or more students completing it together, without the authorization of the instructor, is considered academic dishonesty.
- The act of providing to another student(s) by any means the content of one's own homework or the contents of another student's homework.
- The act of taking homework from another student, or from a classroom, book, bag, binder, workbook, etc.
- Individuals using any website to aid in the completion of homework, including AI or math calculating websites, etc are strictly prohibited. It is an act of academic dishonesty and plagiarism.
- Papers and Projects Papers and projects should be completed only by the student or by the members of a student group constituted by the instructor for the purpose of completing the paper or project in question, without other assistance of any sort, except as explicitly authorized by the instructor.

Discipline Plagiarism/Cheating

I Chronicles 29:17 reminds us that God "tests the heart" and is "pleased with integrity." We want to encourage and equip our students to become disciples of Christ, committed to serving and pleasing God in all that he or she may do.

Generations Christian School seeks to please God in all areas of our lives by upholding to a higher standard; therefore, academic integrity is a standard for all students.

Academic Integrity

Generations Christian School expects students to demonstrate honesty and integrity in all academic work. Plagiarism and cheating are not permitted.

Plagiarism: includes using another person's words, ideas, or work without proper credit, whether copied directly, paraphrased, or summarized. Students must properly cite all sources, including Internet sources.

Cheating: Includes copying or sharing work, answers, or assignments. Students involved in cheating, including both the giver and receiver of unauthorized work, will be subject to disciplinary action.

Plagiarized or cheated work will receive a zero and may result in further disciplinary action.



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Fighting: No student should express aggressive behavior towards another student through verbal or physical threats on or off campus. First offense may result in a suspension or expulsion. A student who demonstrates inappropriate behavior by encouraging other students to fight will be disciplined. First offense may result in a suspension or expulsion.

Bullying: Generation Christian School is committed to preventing bullying in school and making Generations Christian School a safer and more positive place where students can learn. We need your help too. Please take the time to talk about bullying and our school's anti-bullying rules at home with your child. We want to work with you to prevent and stop bullying from happening at our school.
